

Karenni State Human Rights Violation Situation 1st to 28th February 2022

The situation in Karenni State is deteriorating every signal day. We absolutely need more assistance and attention. In the past month alone of February 2022:

At least (8) civilian killed by SAC within February 2022. Up to 80 houses burned and shelled by SAC in Deemaw Soe, Phe Khone and Loikaw township. At least 16 civilian arrested and disappeared. (3) times of Civilian targeted air strike and (8) times of civilian targeted motor shell in Deemaw Soe Township.

2 of 8 civilian were killed by SAC's air strike in Daw Ka Mee and Sele Done village in Deemaw Soe Township. 4 of 8 were killed by SAC after arrested and detain in (6) mile village in Deemaw Soe Township and Warree Su Palain village, in Phe Khone towship. 2 of 8 were killed and burned by SAC in Daw Mukla village, Loikaw township.

16 of civilian detained and/or missing. 10 of 16 civilian Warree Su Palain village, 4 of 16 civilian missing during travel in Hoe Pone village, Southern Shan State. 2 of 16 civilian from Zee Phye Gone village were missing after returned to village from IDP camp.

At list 80 of houses/building burned down and damaged within this February 2022. Up to 60 house/building intentionally burned down by SAC troops in Warree Su Palain village, Wee Thel Ku village as well as in (6) mile village in Deemaw Soe Township. Two Religion building were damaged by SAC motor shelled.

Up to 15,000 new IDP within this February and at least 160,000 Karenni people flee their home as IDP. Most of IDPs stay in IDP temporary camp and shelter. We estimate at least 25,000 Karenni IDP cross the state bordering to Shan State, Karen State and even in Yangon and Mandalay.

We, Karenni Human Rights Group (KnHRG) ask International Community, UN Agencies, INGOs and Karenni Community across the world to ...

- 1) Assist and Support Humanitarian assistance for Karenni IDP (financial and Protection)
- 2) Impose No Fly Zone.
- 3) Impose a global Arms Embargo.
- 4) Targeted sanction including gas Revenue.
- 5) The UNSC must refer the Junta to International Criminal Court.
